The Pierian is proud to offer a contest honoring the poems that shape us. Each contest poem entry must contain a subtitle below its title, in italics, of the form

My Original Poem Title After "Poem Here" by Poet Name Here

e.g.

Morbid Curiosities After "Amor Mundi" by Christina Rossetti

This source poem must be in the public domain and published on or before 1927. Your tribute to it should engage, respond, dispute, answer, or depart from it, as you see fit. Your poem must be between 10 and 30 lines. Free verse and formal verse ok. Your poem must be original work written by you and unpublished anywhere. Any personally identifying information, including your name and contact information, should appear NOWHERE on the submission. Including such information will result is disqualification.

Submissions must be made through the submissions portal at <u>www.thepierian.org/submit</u>. You may mix contest poems and ordinary submission poems as you deem fit.

The Pierian awards USD \$10 per winning entry. *The Pierian* editors may award any number of poems this award, including zero poems. Winning poems may appear in issues as early as March. All winners will be included in *The Pierian* yearly print omnibus. Contest ends **June 1**. You can win more than once.
